28 IBSSA ARTIST NEIGHBORS ARE FOUNDATION OF ART FESTIVAL

The 2015 Sun Circle Art Festival (SCAF) will be held on Saturday, March 14th from 11am to 5pm. The foundation of SCAF is the dedication of **28 artists** who live in our Indian Beach-Sapphire Shores (IBSS) neighborhood.

Sapphire Shores Park, on Sun Circle Drive in the heart of our historic IBSS, is the site of the 2015 annual SCAF. The transformation of the usually quiet area will begin as early as 8am with the bustle of volunteers

assembled by Monica Neligon.

Thank your neighbors whose names are in bold on the **Artist List** on page 2. This is a true family event, including IBSS young artists Grant Burroughs and Lindsay Jennings.

A strong group of 78 juried artists, representing fine arts, crafts, and performances, will show and sell. James Gibson, an original member of the Florida Highwaymen, will return. The entire Sapphire Shores Park area – from North Shore to South Shore – will be set with artists' tents and a performance stage.

Jane Nutter Johnson, Event Chair, began engaging the amazing group of artists during the 2014 Art Festival, and she continued relentlessly until every inch of ground was committed.

Everyone will enjoy the delicacies of the three food trucks, while enjoying the music of IBSS's own Carol Pettengill and Jonathan Pettus. New performers will be young musicians, Sarasota's own puppeteer Doctor Nik, storyteller Sharon Fitzgerald, and a flamenco dance troupe. Young festival attendees will enjoy the park's playground. You will know the 2015 SCAF is coming when you see the Yarn Bombing of the park's

Kate is a hero for making someone happy; she has cash in her pocket and is free from feelings of guilt. Through her willingness to let go, someone else is experiencing joy and Kate is experiencing relief and freedom.

If you missed the yard sale this year, have the courage to add it to your calendar next year. I am only half joking when I say you may become a better person for it.

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH NEWS

As the new year begins, a renewed appreciation comes for being part of such a caring community. Over the years, we have strived to deter crime by becoming more aware and have extended boundaries of concern to reach beyond our own personal space. This ongoing commitment by neighbors to report suspicious, criminal, and dangerous situations is invaluable and, once again, contributed to a reduction of crime within our Indian Beach-Sapphire Shores neighborhood last year.

The Sarasota Police Department reported a city-wide decline in total offenses and an increase in felony arrests for the year 2014. The statistics indicate that identifying and apprehending criminals result in less crime. There has also been an emphasis on crime prevention through detailed crime analysis. A focus on known troubled areas is routine, however, predicting where potential "hot spots" may be brewing is accomplished by intelligence led policing. Monitoring such things as increased calls for service, escalating incidents of crime, observed suspicious activity, calls to the hotline, etc. help police determine where the problem areas and makers are.

Lawbreakers must understand that the law-abiding public will not be easily victimized and will never turn a blind eye to their illicit activities. Working together with law enforcement, we will continue to rid criminals from our streets, better ensure the safety of our families, and preserve the beauty and wonderfully unique qualities of our neighborhood and city.


