

My Neighborhood Vegetable Garden

Two years ago we decided to take our vegetable gardening to a higher level. James built seven 4' x 8' flat bed boxes out of treated wood and filled them with compost dirt from "Big Earth Landscaping". We also expanded our Earthbox collection from four to nine. Earthboxes are self-contained, high-tech growing systems that control soil conditions and eliminate the guesswork out of gardening. They also use less fertilizer, less water, and produce a high yield of vegetables.

Preparation for the vegetable growing season in Florida begins in the middle of August and ends in May. Tomato and pepper seeds are planted indoors and transferred outdoors in September when they are strong enough to tolerate the sun. The plants are protected with screening draped over bamboo poles.

I purchased my tomato seeds from an online company, "Tomato Growers" and my vegetable seedlings were purchased from "Your Farm and Garden" store on Beneva Road. This year we harvested cucumbers, string beans, red cabbage, cauliflower, red peppers, and heirloom tomatoes, along with a variety of herbs. We also grew an assortment of lettuces (new crops were planted every few months), kale, collard greens, and arugula. One of my favorites was the lemon boy tomato, an eight ounce, tangy, easy to grow tomato. Another favorite was the sun gold hybrid cherry tomato. We ate them as quickly as we picked them.

Our tomato harvest was plentiful and we preserved the tomatoes by slicing and drying them in batches for 14 hours in an electric dehydrator. The precious tomato chips were stored in small mason jars and used all year long. I picked the herbs and hung them to dry. Adding fresh herbs to oil olive and freezing them in ice cube trays is a great way to preserve our herbs, defrosting them a cube at a time as needed for cooking.

The biggest challenges we faced with gardening were the worms, fungus, and intense sun. We tried to keep the gardens as organic as possible since we also have butterfly gardens. Neem oil and Bacillus thuringiensis (Bt) were used as needed, sparingly. Daily watering was necessary. Our gardens have been laid to rest for the season and covered with a thick plastic sheet until the fall. Next season we plan to try our luck at growing Brussels sprouts, okra, and radishes.

It is a joy to use fresh vegetables from our garden in our everyday cooking. You can find many of my recipes and photographs of my vegetables on my Facebook blog, "What's Cooking in Debbie's Kitchen". We joke that I grow the veggies, photograph them, paint them, and eat them. Raccoons in IBSS

We saw a raccoon in our yard recently and this evening I received a text from a neighbor that a raccoon was in their yard who was fearless and walked toward her. As I had an unpleasant experience the summer of 2015, I would like to resubmit this article from the IBSSA October 2015 issue. At that time, I was bitten by a raccoon as I intervened when it attacked our cat Pierre. We had Pierre put down as a result of his injuries, and I ended up at SRQ hospital for stitches and the rabies series.



Raccoons in our area have been a problem from time to time. And, they have been known to be rabid. The following is for your information and is from the SRQ County Sheriff's Office, Animal Services, (941-861-9500). The Sarasota County Animal

Services will only get involved with wildlife if it gets injured or fights with pets or people. They will not come to anyone's home to trap wildlife for any other reason. And, they euthanize the animals.

You can rent or purchase a trap and set it on your property. If you catch something, as a public service Animal Services will pick up the animal and euthanize it, up to five animals per year at a charge of \$20 for each pickup.

It is illegal for any person to catch wildlife and relocate it. Only licensed trappers through the State, not County, are allowed to do this. They are licensed from the State of Florida, FWC (Florida Wildlife Commission). See <u>http://myfwc.com/</u> for more information.

It's clear that raccoons in our area is a concern for all of us. If your dog or cat gets in their path, the raccoon will attack your animal. Their teeth are razor sharp. Your pet won't win as the raccoon's skin is thick and tough. I say this from personal experience. Real Estate Update May 27, 2018

We've had quite a few Closings in the last three months (17) and Pending properties are twice what they were in February (13), but this is pretty typical as another busy season comes to an end. We have 32 Active Listings and 4 of those are being built or "to be built". Sales ranged from \$172,000 to \$3,700,000.

Inventory levels have remained very consistent and a bit on the low side these past couple of years. This keeps prices solid and continuing to strengthen at a slow rate.

Interest rates have been climbing noticeably and although they remain historically low, interest on a 30-year mortgage increased about 20% year over year. For Buyers borrowing money, this will decrease how much house they can buy. This could slow improving values in certain price categories.

I am specific to say "certain price categories" because although 50% of Buyers borrow money (remarkably low compared to the rest of the country), the higher the price the more likelihood of a cash buyer and if you have been reading the local press you know higher price categories have been selling well in Sarasota, including IBSS.

The world is still bullish regarding Sarasota. I oftentimes find myself driving down Bay Shore Road being slowed by a couple in a rental car creeping along at five miles an hour totally in awe of where we live. My initial reaction may be annoyance but I try to use this experience like a Buddhist bell...PING! A gentle reminder to slow down and appreciate anew what this couple may be seeing for the first time.

It has truly been a remarkable spring. But now, as summer approaches and Tropical Storm Alberto kicks off Hurricane Season a few day ahead of schedule I am thinking of all the times people ask "What is the best time to put my house on the market?" Without being too much of a data wonk, I try to explain absorption rate. While we may sell more houses "in season" it is from a larger inventory of Listings. And while we may sell fewer houses "out of season" it is from a smaller inventory of Listings. Oddly, what remains consistent is the percentage of available listings sold each month, every month of the year. It is sort of like being a small fish in a big pond or a big fish in a small pond.

So maybe, the question is not "when is the best time" but rather, "when is the best time for me?" And don't forget, the internet changes everything. Your property will be seen by prospects all over the world even if we are in the middle of a named weather event and the Buyer is thousands of miles away, not creeping down Bay Shore Road at five miles an hour.
