Update on Sapphire Shores Park - I promised you this info in our last newsletter.

Post card survey results:


165 Responded with YES votes.

38 Responded with NO votes.

9 Responded MAYBE. Eight maybe's have been called upon, and vote YES after they had their questions & concerns answered.

106 of the YES vote, were paid members of the Association.

18 of the NO vote, were paid members.



As a result of this survey the Board, which acts as a majority of its paid, voting members, will continue to negotiate with the city in an attempt to accomplish the beautification of the park. If the majority of the Association's members had voted against the beautification of the area, we would have discontinued our efforts. Believe me when I say we wish we could please everybody, and that there would not be dissention regarding this issue; but, that's not the case.

At the present time, the Parks Board is to make a recommendation to the City Commissioners regarding the project.

We have been told that the \$30,000 is to come from the lost (local option sales tax) fund, which is money collected from sales tax, and not our ad valorum taxes. It is a special fund. The monies could not be used to house the homeless or feed the needy. It must be used for specific purposes and the beautification of our park area meets these requirements. If we don't use it, the money will be spent someplace else for beautification, etc.

Captain Carter, Patrol Division Commander, met with our Board, with the code book in hand told us that there were plenty of codes already in existence that could control any of the fears addressed by the group in opposition to improving the park. Having designated parking areas, and getting the Commissioners to allow us to post a park closing time would make the enforcement much easier for the police.

Four members of the Board met with four members of the opposition in an attempt to reach some sort of agreement as to what improvements or changes should be made at the park site. The Board suggested that we plant no shrubs, that we plant one-half as many trees as in original sketch, and that we leave the existing grass in place (not level and scrape the area and put in new sod or plugs). We did state that we wanted the two walkways in place, benches, bollards (low posts) to mark designated parking areas (one on the North and South ends, and one in the middle), one-half the number of trees (tall enough that they would not obstruct anyone's view), a very minimal irrigation—system (Swiftmuds low volume recommendation), and some ground cover (native plants that would not require much watering). The end result of the meeting was that the opposition wanted absolutely nothing done to the park. They want to leave it just as it is.

Topic: Report on the NORTH TRAIL SECTOR STUDY

Sherry Plaster, ALCP Senior Planner with the long range Planning Division of the City of Sarasota's Planning Department will bring us a round-up of all the studies being conducted by the Planning Department. The traffic problems, business concerns, concerns of the institutions in our area, urban design, etc. etc. Captain Stan Carter, a resident of Sarasota for 30 years, and IB/SS for 16 of those years will address our group on CRIME AND THE PERCEPTION OF CRIMINAL ACTIVITY which was developed as the Public Safety Element of the Sector Study. The report includes criminal statistics of our area. Captain Carter is Patrol Division Commander. He has been with the police department for twenty-one years.

This presentation, complete with maps, graphs, and other visual aids, will last approximately 30 minutes. It will be a summation of the six meetings that have been open to the public.
