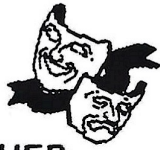

The purpose of The Association is to form a non-profit and non-political organization whose object is to protect the environment, neighborhood safety and property interests of those who own property and/or reside in the area bounded by Sarasota Bay, on the east by U.S. 41, on the north by Poinciana Drive, and on the south by Whitaker Bayou. A further object is to promote good will and a sense of community among the residents and property owners of Indian Beach-Sapphire Shores.

Membership in the Indian Beach/ Sapphire Shores Neighborhood Association has grown significantly in the past two years thanks to the hard work of an energetic group of officers, directors and volunteers

Despite the increase, membership still accounts for only 35% of the total households in the area. As our membership increases, so does the opportunity for our voice to be heard.
