ANNUAL NEIGHBORHOOD MEETING APRIL 10TH AT SUDAKOFF CENTER UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH FLORIDA 7:30 P.M.

Come meet our new city commissioner NORA PATTERSON. She feels strongly about preserving and enhancing neighborhoods, and conserving our Bays. Mrs. Patterson has kept well informed about the North Trail Sector Study, and Gateway 2000's efforts thus far. Come help us extend a real IBSSA welcome to our new District 2 Commissioner. She'll give us a five to ten minute speech and then will remain after the meeting to socialize with us.

Mr. E.J. Stokes, acting Director to Transportation for Sarasota County, and Deputy Director of the Road Program will address our group on the Airport Connector Road/DeSoto Road. Mr. Stokes has been responsible for Sarasota County's road construction program since 1979, after having retired as a Colonel in the Army Corps of Engineers. He will bring charts and schematics along to help us to understand just what is happening in our DeSoto/41 area. Mr. Stokes said to give him ten minutes on the program.

All of you who attended our December annual meeting had an opportunity to hear Sherry Plaster of the City Planning Department explain the North Trail Sector Study to us. Sherry has agreed to give us a five minute presentation as to "where we go from here".

Frank Folsom-Smith, who has represented all of us on the executive board of GATEWAY 2000, will show some slides of the architectural students final suggestions for the improvement and beautification of the Gateway into the city, U.S. 41 or the Tamiami Trail as it passes through our area. Frank says that ten minutes will be sufficient for his presentation.

On the same evening, let's recognize Kerry Kirschner as our outgoing mayor and commissioner who has worked so very hard for us and for Sarasota.

We want to honor all our neighbors who have served either as an officer of the IBSSA or as one of its directors. You'll read more about this in another article in your Newsletter.

Mark your calendars for the annual neighborhood meeting on Wednesday, April 10th at 7:30 p.m. Eileen has arranged for us to meet in the spacious, beautiful Sudakoff Center. Our challenge is to fill the place. It's location is number 10 on the campus map.


