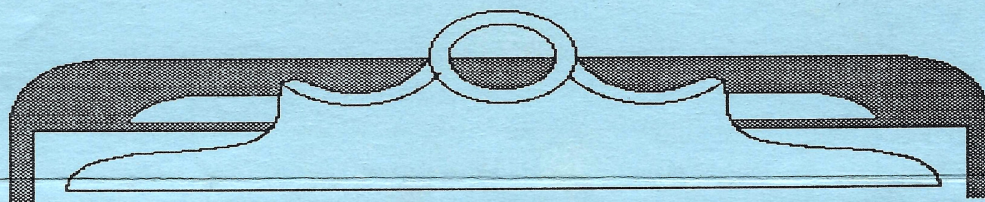

When Mr. Sollenberger first arrived in Sarasota as our city manager, He has agreed to speak for 20 minutes, and then answer questions from you for 10 minutes. Let's all come and welcome him back to the best neighborhood in all of Sarasota.

## Neighborhood Watch Update

The most recent Neighborhood Watch meeting was very informative and proved to be extremely beneficial. We now have a Coordinator in each of the four neighborhood watch areas included in our Indian Beach/Sapphire Shore neighborhood. Each area is located West of the Trail to the bay and as follows:

SAPPHIRE I (58th St. - 47th St.) Coordinator: Debbie Muller 355-5743

SAPPHIRE II (47th St. - Myrtle Ave.) Coordinator: Paul Hoyt 355-6324

SAPPHIRE III (Myrtle Ave. - Indian Beach Dr.) Coordinator: Don Kraft 359-3576

SAPPHIRE IV (Indian Beach Dr. - Whitaker Bayou) Coordinator: Bill Zuk 955-1708

Topics of discussion by Officer Pat Ledwith, Crime Prevention/Neighborhood Watch division, included crime statistics for our area, tips on making our homes less vulnerable to break-ins, a general reminder of how Neighborhood Watch should work in order to be a true crime deterrent, and an announcement about the installation of new neighborhood watch signs. Also mentioned was the S.T.O.P. (Stop Turning Out Prisoners) organization which informs the public of the disastrous consequences of the early release of violent and habitual offenders.

Captain Baty, Patrol division and Captain Blough, Criminal Investigation division also attended the meeting and offered some encouraging information concerning the efforts being made to clean up the North Trail area. A substantial number of arrests have been made this year along the Trail for prostitution, narcotic violations and loitering for unlawful purposes. These actions will hopefully lead to a nicer area along the Trail and to a safer neighborhood for us all.

Most importantly, the neighborhood watch meeting gave us the chance to get together with each other and our local law enforcement officials in order to ask questions, offer ideas and voice particular concerns.

Please become involved with your area Neighborhood Watch Program. Call your Coordinator if you have any questions or suggestions. With the combined efforts of truly concerned neighbors and the support of a responsive Police Department we can enjoy the felling of security in our beautiful neighborhood.
