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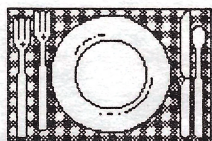

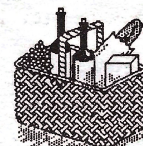

## NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH 1992

This year the city of Sarasota has seen a substantial increase in residential burglaries, auto burglaries and auto thefts. Statistics show that these same crimes are up in our neighborhood along with increased cases of vandalism.

Another cause for concern among many of our residents has been the visible element of prostitution, drug dealing and disruptive loitering along the Trail, especially in the area south of Indian Beach Drive. The authorities are very aware of these conditions and encourage us to call the police if any suspicious activity is suspected.

If you have been victimized:

- 1) Report it to the Police,
- 2) Notify your Block Captain or Neighborhood Watch Coordinator.
- 3) Tell your neighbor so they can be on the look out.

Your participation is vital for a successful Neighborhood Watch program. If you do not know who the Block Captain for your street is, please call me, Debbie Muller at 355-5743. If you need additional information regarding Neighborhood Watch or perhaps would like a security analysis of your home, call Officer Pat Ledwith of the Sarasota Police Department at 954-7057.

The North Trail zoning ordinance was passed unanimously by the City Commissioner on Sept. 16th. Many changes and refinements have been made since it was first drafted and while it is not a perfect ordinance it is a major step toward the redevelopment of the commercial district along the trail. The commission also voted to proceed with a blanket rezoning of the district, therefore sparing both the small property owners and the taxpayers thousands of dollars in planning, zoning and administrative costs that would arise from multiple individual rezoning.

Dozens of citizens spoke at the public bearing, all positive toward the ordinance, with many voicing hope that this is an important step in combatting the economic decay which has led to undesirable uses of the small motels. The citizens and commission were united in their praise for Sherry Plaster who led this effort for the City Planning Dept. and for the private sector leadership of Gateway 2000, chaired by Dr. Ailen Christ-Janer. This is a major victory in the long range improvement of our neighborhood.
