NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH NEWS

Statistics indicate that crime has slightly increased in the City of Sarasota during 1995 compared to this same time last year. The number of arrests being made has also gone up. Our own neighborhood has seen an increase in the number of residential burglaries this year.

Though it is very distressing that criminals seemed to be plaguing our area for a few months, arrests were made in some of the cases, and in two instances, all the stolen property was returned to the owners. The victims of the other burglaries did not have their possessions recovered, however, suspects were identified and again arrests were made due to important information reported to the police by concerned and alert residents. This exemplifies the importance of police-community partnerships and the effectiveness of an active Neighborhood Watch where awareness, concern and communication are practiced among neighbors.


