Pooch Parade and Puppy Services

Hounded by the loss of Jack, our LARGE LABRADOR, Penelope and I are looking to downsize our next doggie. So we are scanning the Humane Society of Sarasota's website about promising pet profiles. Besides beguiling photos, the pups' ages and weights are listed.

Surveying our neighborhood, high end canines that have purebred pedigrees are refined but rare. Ranging from tiny terriers to GREAT DANES, many enjoy one or two dogs but rarely three (And, thankfully, even more rarer are beagles leashed to bikers.) Manly dawgs may be called Ajax or Max while furry females answer to Belle or Ruby.

In the main, almost ALL owners are good about scooping poop. (In fact, our IBSSA membership form includes "Volunteer contributions for doggie bags"). IBSSA also sponsors an annual dog costume contest. This year's special event will be held on November 3 from 1:00 to 4:00 at Sapphire Shores Park. Past entrants have featured hot dogs and lions. And due to the excellent participation in past contests, on October 27th, from 5:00-7:00 at the north end of the Greenway, there will be a Happy Yappy Hour, which will feature an additional dog costume contest!

A widening variety of breeds is what diligent Hector Rodriguez grooms at D'Heros Pet Services in the Indian Beach Plaza. A "professional show groomer for 20 years", Hector states, "We groom everything from Great Danes to Chihuahuas and Labradoodles in between. And we only use hypoallergenic shampoos." Open Mondays through Saturdays, appointments can be made by calling 941-224-5465. "Walk-ins" are also welcome at D'Heros.

Welcoming is Boo's Ice House and Dog Bar. Hospitable signs include "Smile like someone left the gate open". Closed on Mondays but open from lunchtime six days a week, Boo's bar is gigantic. With paw prints lacquered on the tables, patrons relish "puppy pizzas cooked in a wood-fired oven". "Fur" kids of all ages, they can delight in corn dogs and cheese dogs as well as doggie birthday cakes and doggie bags for take home. Accommodating dozens of dogs daily, there are indoor and outdoor spaces for our four-legged friends. "Yappy hours"

occur early and often. (One caveat is "dogs have to create an account and be neutered"). The doggone website is: boosdogbar.com.

When we take our own newest pooch to Boo's Dog Bar, we expect him or her to be a marvelous middle-weight, middle-aged mixture who will be named after consultation.

The Noxious Weed



We recently removed some Australian Pines from our property. The task had been on our radar screen for some time. Have you ever had something on your "to do" list for 20 years? Hurricane Ian steeled my resolve, so we finally got rid of what the State of Florida calls "a noxious weed".

Australians are on the top of most invasive species lists so while we needed a permit, no remediation was required. But we loved our trees. Sure, they grew from a hedgerow in the 1950's to 120-foot monsters tall enough to be used by sailors marking their position in the bay, but we loved the music they made with wind whistling through the boughs and the shade...oh, the shade. Our yard was easily five degrees cooler than the rest of the neighborhood. Removing them was a melancholy occasion and I wanted a way to memorialize these trees.



Our sensitive arborist put me in touch with Red Ranch Productions, a boutique sawmill in Myakka City owned by a young man named Devon. Devon considers himself a "recycler" and makes regular runs into the city to pick up what most people have hauled to the land fill. He is a skilled wood worker making an assortment of furniture. live edge countertops and other items. Spending time with Devon made me realize our "exotic" species in Florida provide some of the most inspiring lumber. Eucalyptus, Java Plum, Monkey Pod, etc...in fact, he was the first person I ever met that spoke of our "noxious weed" as desirable "beefwood". Pound for pound it's about the heaviest wood around and he was excited to have more in his inventory.



I've already had some of ours milled into lumber for future projects. An architect neighbor, savvy to incorporating his own trees into design projects will be getting some planks. I've got an outdoor banquet table on my mind, some benches and a giant charcuterie board! I'm not over the loss yet. Maybe I'll never get over losing some of the things that drew me to this property so many years ago. But this provides a new start and an opportunity to select native species going forward. Birds, butterflies, and the local biome will be beneficiaries of what comes next.

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

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Real Estate Summary

The Indian Beach-Sapphire Shores housing market is somewhat competitive these days, which is a shift from the days of multiple offers. Below are some July highlights:

- The median sale price of a home in Indian
 Beach-Sapphire Shores was \$765K, up
 9.3% since last year.*
- The median sale price per square foot in Indian Beach-Sapphire Shores is \$332, down 4% compared last year.*
- On average, homes in Indian Beach-Sapphire
 Shores sell after 59 days on the market
 compared to 56 days last year.*

Insurance continues to be an issue for many homebuyers in Florida. While this is not new information, the insurance situation seems to be worsening, not only impacting homebuyers, but also homeowners who are seeing rising insurance costs or changes in coverage. Thus, it is deterring buyers and making homeowners rethink staying in Florida.

Florida was a hot spot during and immediately after the pandemic because of affordability, but we are seeing this cool off and people are finding other moderate climate states more attractive for a variety of reasons. Lastly, we can't ignore that it's an election year and you may wonder how this impacts the real estate market. "For instance, data from the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and the National Association of Realtors (NAR) shows that after nine of the last eleven presidential elections, home sales increased the following year".**

While times are changing, we remain positive and will continue adapting to this ever-changing real estate market. The good news – we tend to see an upswing as the weather cools, hurricane season ends and Northerners flock to Florida for the warmer weather and beautiful beaches.
